

Seven Field Kindley High School students joined forces with the Kansas City Chiefs cheerleaders and several retired Chiefs football players in erecting a new playground in a tornado-damaged neighborhood of Joplin, Mo., last week

The seven students were members of the Field Kindley FBLA program, which is a national marketing organization for high school-aged students. For one day, the students put down their marketing materials and picked up shovels, rakes and hoes as the playground took shape at 15th and Connecticut streets in Joplin, said Nick Wenger, Field Kindley FBLA advisor.

"The kids worked their tails off," he said. "It wasn't a day to goof around. They worked hard from morning and through the afternoon."

The playground project was developed through Kaboom and the Play360 initiative, which provides parks and recreational facilities to deserving neighborhoods. The Kansas City Chiefs organization has maintained a strong presence in the rebuilding of Joplin since the May 22, 2011, tornado. Field Kindley volunteered its services to the project after learning of the need for more organization to lend a hand, said Wenger.

"It was an awe some experience, and we were the only school involved in the play ground's construction," he said.

The Field Kindley students weren't allowed to handle the power tools or erect the piping and various features that made up the playground apparatus. Instead, the students had the task of shoveling and moving mulch to the playground's base area, which, Winger said, proved to be a large chore because of the volume of mulch required. The mulch had to be one foot thick in the area under and surrounding the playground apparatus.

Ryan Redington was one of the seven FKHS students to volunteer for the playground project. He said the experience proved to be a thrill, especially when he learned that the Kansas Chief Chiefs organization had purposely planted several tickets for a preseason football game deep in the mulch pile that he and the other FKHS students had to move by wheelbarrow and shovel.

"Someone found the tickets and gave them to me," he said. "I was able to attend the Chiefs' preseason game the next night in Kansas City. That was quite a nice surprise."

Besides working on the playground project, the seven FKHS students also painted garden stones that were eventually used as a sidewalk leading from the parking lot to the playground. They also painted a map of the 50 states on a sidewalk at the playground and helped erect benches and shelters.

"It was amazing to see this project take shape throughout the day," said Wenger.
